SOAHAC provides services to Indigenous people including those who live on and off reserve, status, non-status, Inuit, and Metis within the Southwest and Erie St Clair regions. SOAHAC has a mandate of ensuring that health services are accessible, of high quality, and are culturally appropriate. It is SOAHAC's objective to build health care capacity within Indigenous communities. Currently, we are seeking the services of a **Mental Health & Addictions Counsellor** to join our interdisciplinary staff team to work at our **London site**.

Reporting to the Integrated Care Manager, the **Mental Health & Addictions Counsellor** is responsible for providing effective and comprehensive assessments, counselling and case management for Indigenous people who are living with mental health and substance use issues. This role will be part of an interdisciplinary care team and will also be expected to work and partner with external service providers"

Requirements

- MSW preferred; BSW or a Bachelor's degree in a related discipline required
- Post Graduate Addictions degree or diploma or equivalent experience preferred
- Knowledge of FNIM Traditional Teachings, Culture, Values and History, including intergenerational trauma
- Three to five years of experience working with the Indigenous community using a wholistic model to incorporate traditional beliefs, values and culture-based practices into the therapeutic work to promote wellness and healing
- Three to five years of experience in working with mental health, including providing trauma informed care, and grief counselling, and
- Three to five years of experience in working with substance and/or behavioural addictions, including: concurrent disorders, stages of change, motivational interviewing, harm reduction and relapse prevention
- Knowledge of and ability to use structured screening, assessment, and treatment tools.
- Experience in the delivery of both individual and group counseling using evidence informed approaches
- Knowledge and understanding of services available to FNIM people in the London area and in nearby First Nation communities
- Superior case management skills
- Experience working as part of a multi-disciplinary team
- Proficient time management, organizational and computer skills
- Demonstrated communication skills, interpersonal skills, and professionalism.
- Travel required to SOAHAC sites as necessary
- Required to participate in Indigenous Cultural Safety Training, teachings and ceremonies.

- Valid government issued driver's license and access to reliable vehicle

Responsibilities

- Provide or facilitate the provision of services through a culturally based framework
- Complete screening and comprehensive assessments for issues related to mental health, substance and behavioural addictions
- Develop wholistic, patient centered, individualized treatment plans
- Facilitate individual and group counseling sessions focused improved health and wellness using evidence based therapeutic techniques
- Coordinate access and referrals to local community resources
- Collect, monitor and maintain detailed records on individuals and groups
- Provide comprehensive and effective case management for participants
- Consistently work in collaboration with SOAHAC's Integrated team
- Act as a subject matter expert and consultant to SOAHAC's Integrated team
- Perform ongoing evaluation and improvements to programing and client outcomes
- Partner with community providers to deliver health and wellness activities as appropriate
- Represent SOAHAC at community events
- Provide outreach as required, i.e. attend home and/or hospital visits

This job may require additional responsibilities and duties as assigned by Southwest Ontario Aboriginal Health Access Centre.

This position is based on annual funding and is full-time contract position @ 35 hours per week until March 31, 2021 with a possibility of extension. Salary is competitive and subject to experience and funding. Comprehensive benefit and pension package included.
